Govt. College Dehra affiliated to HPU Shimla vide Notification No. No.-1-677/2017- HPU (Acad)-A dated 21st June 2017 and Re-affiliated to HPU Shimla vide Notification No. EDN-A _KA (1)- 17/2021-L-1 dated 31st August, 2023. In between for the session 2022-23 this college being situated in Distt. Kangra was affiliated to SPU Mandi H.P vide Notification No. SPU- Mandi/ CDC/ 2022- 3387 dated 24th May, 2022. Currently, all the students of B.A/ B.Com 1st, 2nd, 3rd Year for the Session 2025-26 are affiliated to HPU Shimla.

Dehra is the one of the oldest tehsil in Himachal Pradesh and its history traces back to the British regime and further the town of Dehra is cited as a place where traders and foreign invaders used this place as a DERA (Camp) for their expedition to hill states around early 17th century. With times, it may possible that the name DERA got changed to DEHRA. The official name of the town during British Raj was *Dera*; another version related to the nomenclature states that the name “DEHRA” is because it has the temples of many gods and goddesses, including that of Radha- Krishana and “DEHRA” in *Pahari* means a *temple*. It was converted into a tehsil by the British in 1868 from where it started its journey of evolution and development.

The mythological existence of this small river side town is associated with Gopipur where a fierce battle is said to be fought between Lord Krishna and the demon King

Kalyavana on the other shore of river Beas. An ancient Pandav temple is the oldest temple in the town aging from the time of Mahabharata. Dehra is surrounded by the places of tourist interest. The town falls in the vicinity to the Holy shrines of Jawalamukhi (12 Kms), Chintapurani (20 Kms), Baglamukhi (12 Kms), Kaleshwar Mahadev (10 Kms), Muchkund Mahadev (12 Kms) and Dhundeshwar

Mahadev (12 Kms) from Dehra. The first heritage village of Himachal Pradesh Garli-Pragpur (10 Kms), Chanour Thakurdwara Temple (18 Kms), Rock Cut Temple-Masroor (38Kms) and Maharana Pratap Sagar (Pong Dam), Rock-cut temple at Musroor draws thousands of tourists Govt. College, Dehra is all set to work for the betterment of the society and welfare of the students with a vision that “All of us do not have equal talent but all of us have an equal opportunity to develop our talents.” Various cultural, academic and sports activities are successfully organized throughout the year which is likely to increase the strength of the students in the college.

The student centric activities such as National Service Scheme (NSS), Rovers & Rangers, Red Ribbon Club, Road Safety club, Eco Club are gaining momentum throughout the year to this region. Dehra is the gateway to religious and adventure tourism in District Kangra.

With such kind of divine ambience around,. The college Magazine “VYAS-DHARA” has been successfully launched from session 2018-19.

At present college is being run on a makeshift arrangement in GSSS (Boys), Dehra. The School playground is open for our students as well. Admission Rules

1. The Govt. Degree College Dehra followed 200-point roster system for admissions in UG colleges vide instruction issued through The Director of Higher Education Office letter No. EDN-H(8)B(15)-HPU 15/2019 dated 28-08-2020
2. This year college has adopted the offline mode of admission. Students have to fill offline admission Form. Admission to B.Com. / B.A. 1st Year will be made strictly on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination (10+2). The reservation of seats of various categories and sub categories will be applicable as per the reservation roster of H.P.U. Admission to 2nd year and 3rd year will be on roll on basis. Roll on system means the student who has appeared in 1st year will go to 2nd year and appeared in 2nd year will go to 3rd year as per the schedule of admission without waiting for the result of 1st year and 2nd year.
3. Admission to BA/B.Com 1st year will be made on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination (10+2). The reservation of seats to various categories and sub categories will be applicable as per reservation roster of HPU / H.P. Government.
4. Admission to BA/B.Com 2nd Year and 3rd year will be made on roll basis, who are otherwise eligible without waiting for final result. However, he/she will have to fulfil all the formalities laid down by the college administration like filling up of admission form and depositing prescribed fees etc. This will help to start the regular teaching of 1st, 2nd and 3rd Year.

GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

1. Fill up the admission form in your own handwriting and get it signed by parent/ guardian (guardian means only blood relation but he/she should not be a student of this college).
2. The students seeking admission in 1st year may apply in more than one "Core Elective Subjects" specifying their preference order in the admission form.
3. Attach two copies of latest passport size photographs to be pasted on the admission form and bio-data card, self-attested copies of School Board/University certificates from matric onwards, character certificate (original) last attended, SC/ST/physically handicapped, sports/cultural certificate.
4. Attach photocopy of Migration Certificate from School Boards other than H.P.B.O.S.E. Dharamshala.
5. In case of any gap for one or more years in academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/undertaking as a proof of his/her activities during the gap period and character certificate (should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of application) from any Gazetted Officer/ Panchayat Pradhan.
6. Provide original documents and parents being guardian at the time of admission/counselling.
7. The admission to 1st year will be on the basis of merit as per reservation roster and the seats available in all departments.
8. Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach a self attested copy of disability certificate issued by competent authorities.
9. Self attested photocopy of Himachal Domicile certificate for tuition fee concession (Girl student only).

10. Fresh applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl student only) as on 01-07-2025. However, the Vice Chancellor, H.P. University can permit age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of six months.
Relaxation for SC/ST Students: Relaxation of 3 years of age for determination of upper age limit for admission.
11. Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
12. Students are advised to pay their dues on the dates notified from time to time, failing which his/her claim for admission will be forfeited and seat(s) so vacated will be allotted to the next candidate in merit. Fees and funds once deposited will not be refunded.

REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

1. Students who fail in all subjects or fails twice in a class will not be admitted to the class. However, if he/she opts to change the faculty, he/she may be admitted in the 1st year of the changed new faculty, if otherwise eligible.
2. Candidates having a stay of more than six years at any college will not be admitted.
3. The students who are failed or having compartment from other institution will not be admitted in the college.
4. In spite of the eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student is not found good up to the mark during previous years.
5. The Principal reserve the right to reject or cancel the admission of any student without assigning any reason(s) or explanation if situation warrants so.

DOCUMENTS AND CERTIFICATES REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION(FOR NEW ADMISSION ONLY)

The admission form along with bio-data card, Anti-Ragging undertaking and PTA membership form must be submitted along with the following documents:

- * Paste latest own passport size photographs and one photographs of his/her father /mother/ guardian.
- * Self attested copies of detailed marks sheet of matriculation examination onwards.
- * Category certificate for students seeking admission in 1st year against reserved seats (SC/ST/ SP/PC/CUL).
- * Himachal domicile certificate (for girl students only).
- * School leaving - cum - character certificate (original)
- * Migration certificate (CBSE and out of state Students)
- * Photocopy of Aadhar Card.
- * Candidate's bank account number, name and IFSC code of bank.

Note:

- * **Internet results will be accepted only when candidate attach documentary proof showing the detail of marks obtained in the concerned examination.**
- * **The date of issue the character certificate should not be more than six months**

7. UG Program (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM under RUSA (UGC))

Subject Combination for B.A./B.Com. 1st Year & Their Credits shall be offered as per the latest Notification received from the government & University

Instructions for admission to B.A./B.Com 1st year of UGC pass course under RUSA in new CBCS template of UGC for the academic session i.e. 2016-17 onwards:

1. The eligibility conditions regarding the age limit, pass percentage or minimum eligibility etc at the entry level to B.Com./B.A. remains the same as mentioned in the original HP University ordinance.
2. The formation of the units/ number of students in a class / subject remains the same as per the HP Govt. notification of 2015 i.e. first unit / section of subject will be 80 students and subsequent units / section of 60 each depending upon the availability of faculties in the colleges. The admission in different streams will be done as per the HPU roster.
3. Since the executive council of HP University has approved the CBCS template of UGC for the academic session 2016-2017 the combination of elective subject chosen as discipline specific course can be allotted / given to the students as per the availability of faculties in the subject and infrastructure in the respective colleges.
4. For students admitted w.e.f. 2016 onward, the minimum credits to be accumulated for the award of the degree in CBCS (UGC) are 132 for Pass course.

The discipline specified programme chosen by student shall be on choice based credit system, CBCS. The programme shall be considered completed when the student cumulates the requisite number of successful credits (passed) i.e. at least 132 credits for undergraduate degree.

1. Core Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a core course.
2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/ domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

Dissertation/Project: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/ support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/ faculty member is called dissertation/ project.

Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/ subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and viceversa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement;
 - i. Environmental Science and
 - ii. English/MIL Communication.

These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands - on - training, competencies, skills, etc.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

Introducing research component in under-graduate courses project work/dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/analyzing /exploring a real life situation /difficult problem. A project/dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A project/dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

STUDENTS COURSE WISE CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) AND EVALUATION

- All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:
 - Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) = 30 Marks
 - Attendance = 5
 - Mid-term = 15
 - Assignment/Quiz/Seminar etc=10
 - TERM END EXAMINATION (TEE) = 70 Marks.
- Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): This would have the following components.
 - Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% lectures/tutorials/practical as a student having less 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Year Examination (EYSSSE).
 - * Provided that those having between 74 and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
 - * Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by Medical Certificate from Government Hospital.
 - * Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in a prescribed co-curricular activities(e.g. Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
 - * Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemption for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.
 - Classroom Attendance Incentive:

Those having greater than 75% attendance will be awarded CCA marks as follows:

>75% but < 80%	1 Marks.
>80% but < 85%	2 Marks
>85% but < 90%	3 Marks.
>90% but < 95%	4 Marks.
>95%	5 Marks.

 - * For those participating in co-curricular activities 25% will be added to percent attendance.
- Note: The 7.10(D) of HP University clarifies that only those students shall be allowed to appear in the End Year Examination (EYE) who has been successful in the CCA. Minimum marks to qualify the CCA are 35%.

9. Funds/Fine/Rule

1. (a) Every student must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time.
(b) A student will have to pay dues for 1st Year at the time of admission and in the month of October/November.
(c) Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Rs. 10/ per day.
(d) In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of the student will be struck off from the college rolls at the end of that month.
(e) Registration fee will not be charged from the student migrating from another college if he/she is already registered with HP University. Other dues will be charged according as per rules.
2. The name of a student will be struck off from the rolls of college if he/she remains absent without leave continuously for 10 days in any class/subject. (Theory/Practical)
3. In case the name of a candidate is struck off, the re-admission is permissible within first 10 days with a first re-admission fee of Rs. 100/- on a prescribed proforma. If a candidate fails to seek re-admission within first 15 days then he/she should seek re-admission up to 20 days, on payment of Rs. 200/- as second re-admission fee on the personal presence of parent/guardian. After 20 days from the date his/her name is struck off there shall be no re-admission in any case.
4. Every student will have to procure no Dues Certificate from the Library, NSS, NCC, Sports, College Canteen, Fee Clerk etc. if he/she wants to leave the college.
5. The Principal can expel a student from the College if he/she is found guilty of misconduct/ indiscipline/ragging.
6. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.
7. The fine for absence has to be paid with dues, while fine imposed otherwise has to be deposited by the date announced, in the college office/fee counter.
8. Contribution towards PTA funds Rs. 500/- per student per Annum.
9. No Tuition fee is charged from the Bonafide Himachali girl students, subject to production of H.P. Bonafide Certificate at the time of admission.
10. Students having more than 40% disability are exempted from tuition fee.
11. Migration Fee (from other Board) 400/-

11.SCHOLARSHIPS/LEAVE RULE

The College offers various scholarships to the students regulated by the rules available in the college office. Application for these scholarships should be submitted in the college office, after therecommendation of the concerned teacher along with copy of Aadhar Card and photocopy of the Bank A/c Passbook with IFSC code. The College offers following scholarships:

11.1 Leave Rules :

(a) General Leave Rules :-

1. Students can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave form.
2. Leave upto 6 days is to be recommended by concerned course teacher and sanctioned by the Head of Dept. of major subject of the student. For more duration i.e. upto 10 days, a student must get application signed by the Principal.
3. Leave during House Examination/Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on recommendation of the Head of Department.
4. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate

(b) Duty Leave Rules:-

Participation by the students in Sports/Cultural/NSS/NCC/Co-Curricular activities, Inter-College/University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition (s); Duty leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity in charges, prior proceeding to the event.

11.2 MID TERM TEST AND LECTURE ATTENDANCE

All the students have to appear in the Mid Term test (MTT) which will be conducted in the month of Dec. 2025. Every student has to appear MTT and secure at least 40% marks in each subject or 40% marks in aggregate, failing which he/she shall be debarred from appearing in University Examination. Moreover a student who fails to show satisfactory result in MTT shall forfeit his/her claims to fee concession or other financial assistance. The students are required to be punctual and regular in their classes. According to the University rules every student must attend 75% lectures both in Theory & Practical Separately. The Principal can condone the actual participated days in every course including practicals in respect of students who have missed the classes on account of their participation on Ranger-Rovers/Sports/Cultural/Academic Activities.

11.3 Library:

College Library has around 646 books. This year treasure of the library will be enriched by adding more books since grant has been received from the government for this purpose.

Rules:

1. Two books will be issued on the identity card for 15 days.
2. Reference books are not issued.
3. Delay in return of book on due date, a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day will be charged.
4. If a book is mutilated or defaced by the student, the cost of book will have to be deposited along with fine.
5. In case of loss of a book, the student will have to pay present cost of book along with fine.

12. CO-CURRICULAR & EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

- 12.1 Sports:** The College provides facilities to sports person and the teams prepared for university championship are:
Athletics, Basket ball, Boxing, Chess, Cricket, Wrestling, Weight Lifting, Volleyball, Badminton etc.
- 12.2 Cultural:** The students find an opportunity to take part in HPU Youth Festival Gp-I, II, III & IV on the basis of the talent they excel during the college cultural activities viz-Debate, Declamation, Quiz, Painting, Poster making, College Rangoli, Music (V&I), Dance, Drama, Skit & mime.
- 12.3 N.S.S. :** In order to develop leadership quality, Communal harmony along with labour Culbing one unit of NSS is active with the motto “Not me But you. The enrollment is done on the basis of selection. The students learn to Serve, Sacrifice and Discipline, in their lives through one day & seven days camps.
- 12.4 Rover and Rangers:** The College runs units of R & R in which 24 Rovers (Boys) & 24 Rangers (Girls) are members of one unit. It is playing an important role in the lives of young students as they get awareness about social, communal and National problems of Society.
- 12.5 CSCA:** College Students Central Association is elected as per the norms and directions of H. P. University and following the recommendation of Lyngdoh committee. The body helps the college administration in the smooth functioning of its activities.
- 12.6 College Magazine:-“Vyas Dhara” :** To bring out the creative talent of the students, the college magazine is published every year. The Magazine is having four sections, each section after receiving articles is edited by a staff editor and assisted by student editor.
- 12.7 Educational Tour:** The Educational Tours are arranged during winter vacations by the concerned committee to visit scientific, Historical, Industrial places to gather knowledge. The college provides financial support as permitted under rules. The students have to produce written permission from their parents to accompany the tour.
- 12.7 Careers Guidance, Counseling & Placement Cell:** For the guidance of the students of the college, this cell has been constituted. Their counseling and placement in different fields is monitored by this cell for the bright future.
- 12.8 Tutorial Management Cells:** Tutorials are constituted of each subject. The concerned Teachers of concerned Subjects will be tutors. The Head of Department will act as senior tutors & the Principal will be Tutor-in-Chief of the tutorial management cell.
- 12.9 Red Ribbon Club:** The college has Red Ribbon Club which aware students against dreaded disease like HIV & AIDS through various programmers & competitions. This club also organize blood donation camps to encourage students donate blood for the sake of humanity under the motto **donate blood save life.**
- 12.10 Eco –Club:** The College has Eco- Club which aware students about sustainable environment.
- 12.11 Road Safety Club:** The Road Safety Club which aware students and community about road Safety rules.

14. ANTI-RAGGING AND DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance for ragging and its total elimination in the educational institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001, 16th May 2007 and 11th Feb, 2009 has directed as here under:

1. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the institution.
2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiable harsh.
3. Punishment for ragging includes:
 - (i) Imprisonment/fine or both.
 - (ii) Expulsion from the institution, suspension from institution or classes for a limited period and fine with a public apology.
 - (iii) With holding scholarship or other benefits.
 - (iv) Debarring from representation in events.
 - (v) Withholding results.
 - (vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
4. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment shall be resorted to.
5. Character/Migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have an entry apart from that of general conduct and behavior to the effect whether the student had participated in ragging and in particular was punished for ragging.
6. In case the applicant is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or it is noticed later that he/she had indulged in ragging, his/her admission may be refused or he/she would be expelled from the institution forthwith.

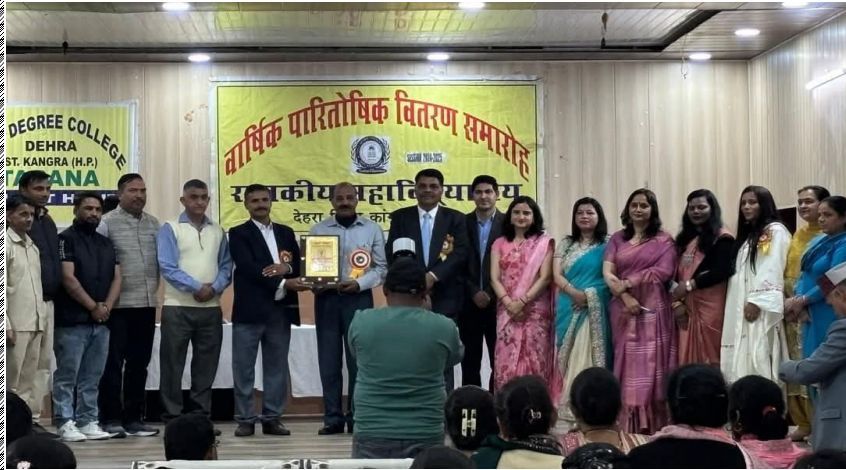

- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament or youth festival etc.
- Collective punishment : when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on potential ragger.
